A.L. Wood was the PP. captain in 1876. Later he became a noted player in the Stonehaven area and played in Scottish XI's of his time. He was a brother of Alex Wood, the midget cap.

FR. Sanderson, the youngest of the Sanderson brothers, was "a colt of last year's XI". GL. Crole, later Sheriff Crole, was also described as a colt.

WA. McLaren is now described as "the veteran".

Angus Buchanan, who married the Sanderson's sister, "bowls swift". In one match against Carlton at Helwood was run out "because of another match taking place in the same field".

Against Edin. Acads. Mark Sanderson broke a nail with a catch and then lost the nail while batting.

Against Kettle Nat. Watt batted through the innings for 29\* out of 95.
